Re-designed by architect Susan Biegner of Biegner-Murff Architects, constructed by Joe Costello of Stonecreek Building Co., interiors by Terese Messina and landscape architecture by Jeff Berghoff, this special renovation proved to be an artistic, unfeigned ode to a era gone by.

A reflection of the allure that has drawn many to the Valley for generations, this home echoes the seductive sentiments of a special place in time. Its compound-like structure resonates with a touch of nostalgia - one that is a bit reminiscent of the peacefulness you'd feel as you listen to an old Stevie Nicks song. Refreshingly *not* a new build, this home has been

restored by its new owners with an ernest effort to preserve its original character. Their appreciation for clean lines, organic and streamlined forms shines through in every detail. Tucked away in a neighborhood which remains somewhat of a hidden gem within a coveted corridor between the north slope of Camelback and south side of Mummy Mountain, the property is cradled within an area which is filled with some of the most wondrous wildlife and lush desert landscape in town. It's off the beaten paths and is thankfully less traveled by anyone other than those who happily call it their home.

When the privilege to feature this exceptional property came to us, our enthusiasm was reignited for those who are willing to go above and beyond, sparing no effort or expense to ensure perfecting the past. This home stands as a testament to such dedication - one of passion and commitment to excellence.



Typical of mid-century ranch-style homes made of concrete and stucco which were built in the 50's throughout Paradise Valley and surrounding areas, this home came with unique quirks and very unconventional details. However, it offered exactly what its new owners were looking for style-wise and, more importantly, it was exactly where they wanted to be. The original home had a charm that resonates a touch of nostalgia with irreplaceable locale.

For the interiors, designer Terese Messina collaborated with the owners to create a neutral palette with rich textures that told a story of their life and lifestyle. Bold accents of terra cotta, gold, olive, and blue added energy to the space. The overall aesthetic aims to evoke a vacation vibe, blending elements of Cabo, Santorini, and the high desert with a Mediterranean touch. Throughout the interior and exterior spaces, an incorporation of global influences like raffia lighting, kilim benches, and African masks, lends itself to a bohemian, well-traveled feel. Elements like the off-center fireplace and ornately carved doors pay homage to Arizona's architectural heritage, adding a touch of Old West dazzle.

The house is situated on an irregular lot which resulted in an unconventional layout. Architect **Susan Biegner** and builder **Joe Costello** worked on simplifying the architectural elements to create a better connection between the house and its surroundings. They cleaned up soffits, exposed ceiling beams, enlarged windows, and added a new patio by opening up the west wall which all had a significant impact on transforming the spaces.

The renovation process emphasized the importance of preserving the house's unique qualities and imperfections which were all key to the end result.
